Our school strategies are on track to meet or exceed our targets

During 2017, we have focused on maximising the benefits of this funding for our students. After reviewing our *Investing for Success* agreement, it is clear that we are on track to meet or exceed our targeted student outcomes. We continue to implement our strategies to ensure that every student succeeds.

Strategies implemented include:

- Strengthening teacher understanding and knowledge of the Australian Curriculum and Explicit Instruction
- Building teacher capacity to consistently implement Essential Skills for Classroom Management
- Engaging Internal and External Positive Behaviour for Learning Coaches
- Providing focused and intensive teaching targeted at 'C' students in order to improve the quality of their demonstrations of learning against the relevant year-level achievement standard
- Strengthening the case management approach for secondary students through targeted attainment and transition programs
- Implementing intervention programs for students across the college
- Employing a SLP to support speech and language development

Our school strategies are showing substantial progress toward our targets

After reviewing our *Investing for Success* agreement, it is clear that we have made progress toward our targeted student outcomes. We will continue to focus on maximising the benefits of this funding for our students, and adjust our strategies as needed to ensure every student succeeds.
