This funding will be used to

- Improve every student's reading and writing performance across the college from Prep to Year 12 through a targeted inclusion and learning support model.
- Improvement in level of achievement in English, Mathematics and Science to 80% or higher achieving at least a C.
- Implementation of the Australian Curriculum ensuring 'every student can succeed' through a school wide model of differentiated planning and delivery.
- Building staff capacity through quality professional learning focused on the Berry Street Education model for trauma informed practice.

Our initiatives include

- Collaboratively develop an inclusion and learning support model in the college and resource the model to support literacy and numeracy intervention.
- Support teachers to develop planning and intervention programs across the college with the learning support team.
- Support teachers to build their knowledge and capability in delivering the Australian Curriculum, focused on delivery of a model of differentiation
- Build teacher capability of trauma informed practice through the implementation of key strategies of engagement within the Berry Street Education model.
